1. P-2 literacy support -50\% staffing support allocation, Kathryn Arseneau came out of $50 \%$ classroom and now does this $50 \%$ support position, mostly full class support, or small groups. Early intervention is key for this age range, and now they are already getting support and making strides in their reading levels, hitting year end benchmarks now in April. The support is greatly appreciated by classroom teachers. Hoping that it will become a permanent position; it is currently a pilot. Early intervention makes a significant difference in helping younger students be successful so that more intensive support is not required as they get older.

2. Enrolment and staffing numbers for next year - currently at 398, down about 40, only 12 in pre-primary right now - 190 French 210 English includes pre-primary. Pre-primary registrations are likely to increase over the summer. Currently anticipating the same number of homerooms as we have in the current year. Out of area isn't decided until June. Staffing allocations will be out May $5^{\text {th }}$, May $10^{\text {th }}$ is the first round for job postings
3. Purchasing school supplies for next year - include the purchased items again, investigate including the white board markers and white boards for next year.

Parent feedback is that it is nice to see the children outside playing again in the morning, the students still use their assigned doors, parents are still getting used to the change. Seems like the students are able to play outside and then settle into the classroom quicker than expected. Plan in September until Remembrance day and then go in for the winter and then back out after Easter. Teachers have a schedule for morning duty.
